Waterfront Director

Purpose: Responsible for all aquatic activities as outlined in the Camp Nejeda Aquatic Program Manual.

Qualifications:

1. Minimum 21 years of age.

2. Current lifeguarding, CPR, and First Aid certifications from the American Red Cross or an organization having equivalent and accepted standards.

- 3. At least one year's work experience at a camp waterfront.
- 4. Familiarity with pool maintenance, including testing, treating, and cleaning the water.
- 5. Familiarity with diabetes management is preferred. (Training provided)

Responsible To: Certified Pool Operator (CPO), Maintenance Director, Director of Programs, and Camp Director

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Review the Camp Nejeda Aquatic Program Manual prior to the camp season.
- 2. Review the American Camping Association (ACA) and NJ Department of Health (DOH) aquatic regulations.
- 3. Work with the CPO and Maintenance Director throughout the summer to ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.
- 4. Conducts daily tests of pool water.
- 5. Maintains pool log that includes daily water test results, cleanliness, clarity, temperature, and other required information, including on closing day of session.
- 6. Monitors daily cleanliness of all aquatic facilities and aquatic areas.
- 7. Reports all pool problems to the CPO, Maintenance Director, or Camp Director.
- 8. Performs skill verification for Aquatic Staff throughout the summer.
- 9. Schedule Aquatic Staff to aquatic areas throughout the summer.
- 10. Evaluates Aquatic Staff throughout the summer and coaches them as needed.
- 11. Select and train an assistant each session to fill in during days off.
- 12. Tests and classifies swimming ability of campers on opening day of each session.
- 13. Supervises camp staff in carrying out lifeguarding duties during use of aquatic areas.
- 14. Conducts lost swimmer drills with Aquatic Staff throughout the summer.
- 15. Coordinate with camp administrators to take weekly pool sample to lab.
- 16. Organize polar bear swims and creates interest in polar bear program.
- 17. Creates enthusiasm among campers and staff as pertains to all aquatic areas including log rolling, swim lessons, boating activities, and other activities.
- 18. Creates alternate activities if pool is inoperable.
- 19. Assign non-lifeguards as assistants in aquatic areas to manage such things as pre-swim shower, use of buddy board and swim tags, charging pumps, and treating lows.
- 20. Conducts buddy checks on a regular basis as required.
- 21. Works with Camp Director to plan and implement all trips involving aquatic activity, including packing and unpacking vehicles.
- 22. Facilitates medical staff swims, staff evening swims, and evening pool parties.
- 23. All other duties as assigned.
- 24. Plan and provide swim lessons with fellow aquatic staff to campers during choice period

Essential Functions:

- Ability to observe, train, evaluate, and instruct lifeguarding staff.
- Ability to maintain the pool in accordance with all regulations.
- Ability to assess the safety and operation of all waterfront areas.
- Ability to provide leadership.
- Ability to make schedules and work in partnership with other directors.
- Ability to ensure the safety of all campers and staff at all aquatic areas.
- Availability to work full summer.
